Read the First Promise.

Read the Second Promise.

Think of a harm you created within a faith community. Did you have a chance to repent? Was there reconciliation?

Read the Third Promise.

Tell the story of your first invitation to an Episcopal Church. If you have spent your whole life as an Episcopalian, tell the story of being invited to a particular Episcopal Church.

Read the Fourth Promise.

What do you love about yourself? How have you discovered something sacred about yourself because someone else pointed it out?

Read the Fifth Promise.

Share a time when you have "othered" someone to avoid having to respect their dignity.
