The Foundation is dedicated to fulfilling God's work in the world by granting funds to Episcopal ministries in the Episcopal Church in Western Oregon that strengthen the community by serving others.

Vision Statement

The Foundation envisions an Oregon where the people of the church joyfully invite everyone to share in a beloved community rooted in justice and abundance.

Episcopal Bishop of Oregon Foundation (EBOF) fulfills God's work in the world by granting funds for ministries that seek Gospel Justice by addressing tangible needs such as housing, food, and the well-being of seniors, youth, and families. EBOF also funds ministries that serve others through healing, racial justice, and inclusivity throughout the diocese.

Our strategic priority through 2023-2024 is to support ministries in rural communities.

- All Episcopal faith communities
- Affiliated Episcopal ministries such as 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations with relationships with the diocese or faith communities
- Episcopal Chaplaincies

GUIDELINES

The Board of Directors of EBOF realizes that guidance is useful to grant applicants as they decide whether or not to pursue a request and as they formulate applications. To assist in this process we have adopted the following guidelines. As guidelines they are subject to review and modification at any time by the Board.

- o Grants should be consistent with the criteria for funding established from time to time by the board.
- O Grant support is generally available for a maximum of three years at a maximum level of \$25,000 per year and applicants should design the program to be completed within that time or should express how the program will transition to other revenue streams. Grants will normally not exceed more than \$75,000 in a five year period.
- O A grant recipient should anticipate being asked to prepare news releases and news articles about the grant for use by local media outlets. The diocesan office is available to assist with this work.
- O Parish applications must be current with their submission to the diocese of parochial reports, annual audits and assessments.
- o Grants are not available for retirement of debt, establishment of endowments, and restoration of savings and investments.
- o EBOF does not make loans.
- o Grant applications will include:

- O A narrative proposal and/or letter of length adequate to help the Foundation understand your organization and request. Brevity is appreciated and should be limited to four pages of 8.5"x11" with a minimum font size of 10.
- o List of your Board of Directors, Vestry or BAC.
- o Detailed budget for proposed project.
- O Statement describing financial condition of applicant organization to include the last fiscal year, the current year to date and the most recent audited report.
