Amendments related to The Annual Meeting of Convention

Canon 1.1

- 1 Sec. 1.(a) There shall be an annual meeting of the Convention, the time and place to be set by
- 2 the Bishop in consultation with the Standing Committee, *and announced at the annual meeting*
- 3 the preceding year.
- 4 (b) In the event of an emergency as determined by the Bishop in consultation with the
- 5 Standing Committee, the Bishop, with the concurrence of the Standing Committee, may call for
- 6 any Annual or Special Convention to be conducted, in whole or in part, by electronic transmission
- 7 or by electronic video screen transmission pursuant to rules of order that provide the Clerical
- 8 and Lay members a reasonable opportunity to participate in the Convention and to vote on
- 9 *matters submitted to the Convention, including an opportunity to read or hear the proceedings*
- 10 of the Convention concurrently with those proceedings. The Secretary of the Convention shall
- 11 maintain a record of any votes or other actions taken by means of electronic transmission or
- 12 <u>electronic video screen communication. Participation in the Convention through the use of</u>
- 13 *electronic transmission or electronic video screen communication pursuant to this Canon*
- 14 *constitutes presence in person at the Convention for all purposes.*
- 15 Sec. 2. Notice of the time and place of every annual or special meeting of the Convention<u>, and</u>
- 16 of any change therein, shall be given by the Secretary to every Member of the Clergy, to every
- 17 lay delegate whose election has been certified to the Secretary, and to the Clerk of every
- 18 Congregation in the Diocese at least 30 days before the time appointed for the meeting. In the
- 19 case of a special meeting, the notice shall also include a verbatim copy of the call issued by the
- 20 Bishop. Failure to provide timely notice of the annual meetings of the Convention shall not,
- 21 however, invalidate the Convention.
- 22 **Sec. 3.** (a) At least three <u>six</u> months prior to the annual Convention, the Bishop shall appoint the
- 23 committees of Convention which shall include a Committee on Dispatch of Business, <u>a</u>
- 24 <u>Committee on Constitution and Canons</u>, a Committee on Resolutions of Policy, a Committee on
- 25 Courtesy, and such other Committees as may be necessary for the Convention to carry out its
- responsibilities. <u>Each committee shall have an odd number of members</u>. The members of <u>these</u>
 committees shall be selected from among the lay and clergy delegates certified to the Secretary
- as of the date of appointment, *or Officers,* and shall be, to the extent possible, representative of
- both orders and the breadth of the diocese. *No delegate may serve on more than one of these*
- 30 <u>committees.</u> The appointments shall be communicated to all delegates.
- 31 (b) The Committee on the Dispatch of Business shall consist of <u>at least</u> 3 members, including at
- least one lay and one clergy delegate. <u>The Secretary of the Convention shall be an ex officio</u>,
 voting member. The Committee shall meet not later than 60 days prior to the annual
- 34 Convention, shall prepare the Order of Business to be presented, and shall cause a copy of
- 35 the Order of Business to be sent to each Member of the Clergy in the Diocese and to each
- 36 Lay Delegate not later than 30 days prior to the annual Convention. The Committee shall also
- present the Order of Business at the opening of the annual Convention for approval, as
 presented or amended, by the delegates.

The arrangements must provide reasonable opportunity for full participation by members of the committee holding the hearing, other delegates 60 61 and members of the Diocese, and minutes or a recording of the hearing to be made 62 available to absent committee members. - 92 obtaining <u>the</u> written sponsorship or endorsement of a Lay Delegate, <u>a</u> Member of the Clergy
- 93 entitled to seat and vote, a Vestry or Bishop's Advisory Committee, a Convocation, or a
- 94 Commission or Committee of the Diocese.
- (b) All proposals for amendments to the Constitution or Canons of the Diocese, shall be
 submitted, in writing, to the Secretary by the person or persons initiating such changes at least
 90 days prior to the annual Convention. As soon as practicable, Within five business days, the
- 98 Secretary shall send copies of the proposed changes to each member of the Committee on

- 107 sponsorship or endorsement of a Lay Delegate, a Member of the Clergy entitled to seat and
- 108 vote, a Vestry or Bishop's Advisory Committee, a Convocation, or a Commission or Committee of109 the Diocese.
- (b) Resolutions of Policy shall be submitted, in writing, to the Secretary by the person or
 persons initiating them at least 90 45 days prior to the annual Convention. <u>Within five business</u>
 <u>days</u>, The the Secretary shall immediately send copies of the proposed resolution to each

- 120 **Sec. 6.** At any session of the Convention, the Bishop, or other duly constituted President of the 121 Convention, may designate a temporary presiding officer from among the Lay or Clerical
- 122 Delegates present at that particular session to preside over the Convention.

- 124 Sec. 7 (a) At or before each annual meeting of the Convention, the Bishop shall appoint a Post-
- 125 Convention Committee, consisting of five persons, *including at least one lay and one clergy*
- 126 *delegate from the Convention,* to serve until the Committee reports to the next annual

- 127 Convention. The Bishop shall also appoint one of the members as convener, who, working in
- 128 cooperation with the Secretary of Convention, shall call the first meeting of the Committee, to
- 129 be held within 20 days after the meeting of Convention adjourns.

Explanation:

The several proposed changes in 1.1 are intended to align our canons related to the administration of the Convention with the needs and realities of our convention practices. Changes address the reality of new communication media and rhythms of convention deadlines. Some changes are made to reflect the ongoing practical reality of the diocese: for example, that we have not in recent practice had a Committee on Credentials and because credentialing is managed by diocesan staff, we do not need one. Other changes include revising timelines for submitting resolutions and proposals for amendments. Finally, some revisions are intended to make provisions in the canon more clear in their intent.
